The purpose of this program is to improve the outcomes for AI/AN youth in area public schools. The WNTP Staff serve as the liaisons between families and area school districts to ensure that students have the materials and resources to succeed at school and in the community. They also provide direct services to AI/AN students at various school sites throughout our district.
